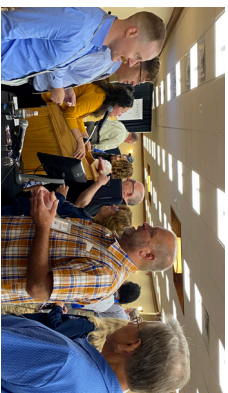

2020

CONNECT received an endowment of \$1 million housed at the Pittsburgh Foundation



...we develop shared projects in Infrastructure & Resilience.

CONNECT and partners seek to reduce risk, save taxpayer dollars, and improve our communities as our region changes. The CONNECT Climate Action Plan, developed in partnership with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and ICLEI-Local Governments for Sustainability, aims to support our members' existing

plans, coordinate additional meaningful action, and build on the efforts we're already working on together. CONNECT has helped dozens of communities weigh their options, apply for funding, and start projects together; including over 20 individual successes in EV charging, transportation policies, energy efficiency, and climate planning since

2022. In 2022, a partnership with PA Solar Center launched GET Solar CONNECT, providing over \$150,000 in bulk consulting services to 13 governments and authorities for free, resulting in an assessed solar potential of 7MW over 37 public facilities, and unique joint financing offerings for our members.

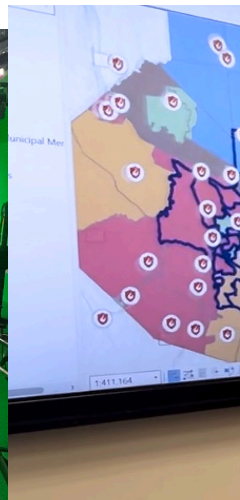
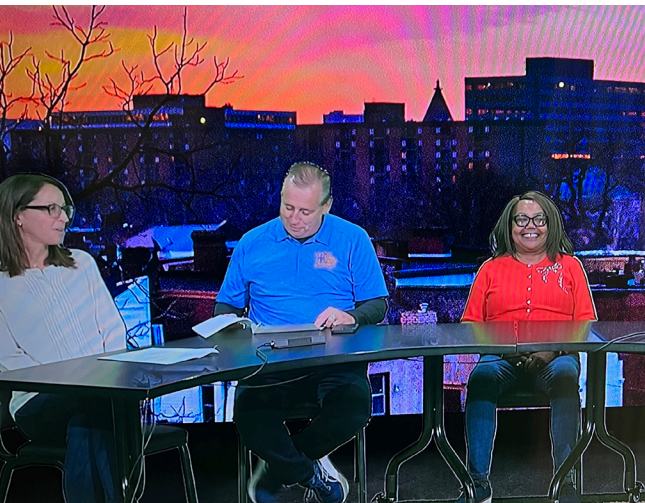


...we innovate in Public Safety & Wellbeing.

LEAD (Law-Enforcement Assisted Diversion) is a community-based program we launched in 2022, to divert people with unmet behavioral health needs and substance use disorder away from arrests or citations and into comprehensive community-based care. LEAD expanded into 13 communities, including the City of Pittsburgh. Over

140 people have been referred to LEAD since 2022, connecting them with services such as housing support, GED training, parenting classes, drug and alcohol rehabilitation, conflict resolution, and more. The Future of Fire program was developed in 2019 to support nonprofit volunteer fire departments and municipal officials by building

collaborative capacity within Allegheny County. Throughout 2023, building off of our Building Collaborative Capacity and Needs Assessment report, our Future of Fire Consultant, Anthony Terrace, engaged with various municipal officials and fire department chiefs.



...we collaborate in Communications & Technology.

CONNECT works hard to improve the communications and technology of our member municipalities, as well as to serve as a model for best communications practices. Our members provided important feedback as part of our broader strategic planning about what would best serve them on a new CONNECT website.

The Communications & Technology Working Group was formed to advise this process and discuss the broader communications needs of our members, and provide comments for the State Digital Equity Plan. Working with the University of Pittsburgh Graduate School of Public and International Affairs, capstone Pitt students and CONNECT

interns produced several reports on the topic: "Digital Governance in Municipal Governments: Equity, Access, and the Digital Divide" (Fall 2022), "Digital Governance in Municipal Governments: Improving Digital Access and Safety for Municipalities" (Fall 2023).



...we develop local government research.

CONNECT's longstanding relationship with the region's academic institutions has allowed us to produce cutting edge research in the public policy sphere. Capstone classes at the University of Pittsburgh Graduate School of Public and International Affairs conducted research on volunteer fire service, digital equity and governance, climate

emissions, and diversion programs, all of which became CONNECT priorities spearheaded by our members and staff. CONNECT will continue this relationship by convening a group of academic and subject experts as part of the CONNECT Research Council.
